
#### 2019 THEME: Grounded in Truth. Walk Together with Courage.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

In 2013, Ray Thomas won the prestigious Deadly Award for a loving painting of his mother, Alice, then the oldest living Gunnal woman.

#### **SUSTAINABILITY GROUP & VEGGIE GARDEN**

Thank you to all of the families who have got on board with the Nude Food Tuesday Challenge. It has been so great to see the children so excited to share with us that they have brought their package free lunchbox to school. Don't worry if you have missed the first couple of weeks of the challenge, you can join in at any time.

It has been wonderful to again have so many eager gardeners helping in the veggie garden at recess and lunchtimes on Tuesdays! This week we were planting some potatoes, getting our garden bed prepared for planting next week and watering the plants that are already growing. If you haven't already seen them, the pumpkin plants are thriving and the pumpkins are starting to form. The kids have been very excited to spot them growing.









Ingrid has had a wonderful idea for families who would like to be composting their food waste but do not have a compost bin at home. We now have lidded buckets that families can take home, fill up with food scraps and return and empty into the school compost bins. If anybody would like to be a part of this, you can find Ingrid and myself in the Veggie garden on Tuesday mornings or leave a message for us on the Paynesville Primary School facebook page to organise to pick up your bucket.


