Grade 1/2 Historical Evidence Visit - Russell Mullet

Russell Mullet came to visit the grade 1-2 class in the final week of our theme of looking at different sources of historical evidence.

He created a whole simulated archaeological dig for the grade 1-2 students, where he showed them exactly how to sift through and document items that are uncovered in an archaeological dig. He brought in a whole wooden box of dirt in a wheel barrow, in which he had buried various items that would typically found in an archaeological dig in Gippsland. Using a wooden trowel and a brush, he showed them how to scrape back a thin layer of dirt. When the first items like a plastic clothes-peg and a bread tag started to appear, he showed the students how to brush the dirt off very gently with a brush. He also showed them how to note down on a diagram, where each item was found, and to measure and identify exactly where and how deeply in the earth it was found. As he proceeded to work his way deeper into the dig, he showed students how the items began to change to shells, animal bones and stone tools.

It was a really fascinating demonstration and the students were so lucky to get to see exactly how an archaeologist works out in the field.
