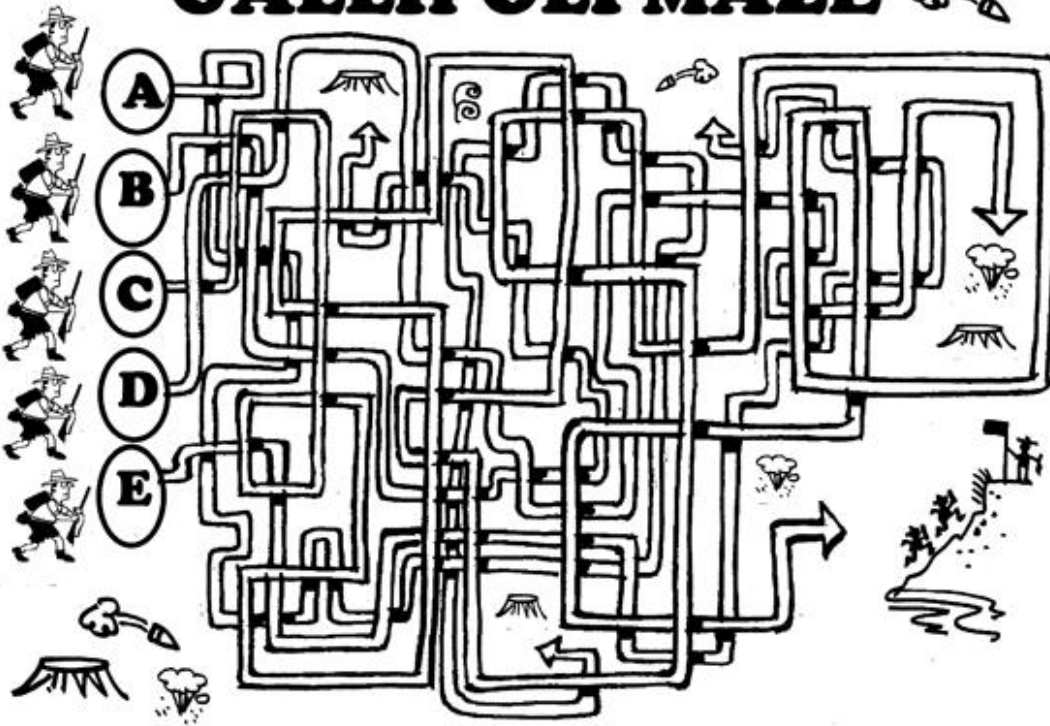

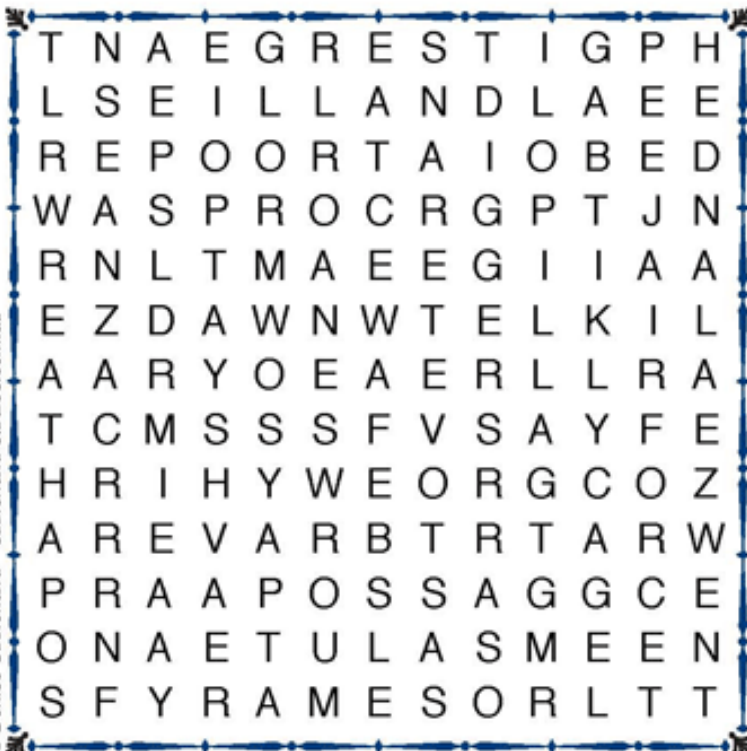
GALLIPOLI MAZE
