## **New Zealand Trip Report**

Last week 29 Grade 5 and 6 students travelled to New Zealand to visit our sister school (Chelsea Primary) and to see some of the sights of this beautiful country. We travelled to Melbourne by bus and then boarded a plane to Auckland. From Auckland airport we caught a shuttle through the city and over the Harbour Bridge to the North Shore. We met our host families and headed to their homes after a long day of travelling.

The next day we worked at school with our New Zealand host studentS. We attended classes and sports clinics.

On Tuesday we travelled to the Auckland Museum and attended a Maori Welcome (including Haka). After that we caught a bus to the Sky Tower and we climbed the tallest structure in the Southern Hemisphere. Students loved the view and some of them loved walking on the glass floor.

On Wednesday we travelled north of Auckland towards the Bay of Islands to Waiwera. At Waiwera we visited the thermal hot pools and rode the hydro slides. On Thursday we stayed at school and undertook cooperative activities with our Kiwi friends.

On Friday we caught a boat up the harbour to Rangitoto Island. Rangitoto is a dormant volcano rising up out of the sea. We climbed to the top via the Lava Caves. We had lunch looking back over Auckland Harbour and then headed back to the mainland.

On Saturday we travelled with our host families South of Auckland to Rainbows End

Theme Park. We rode crazy rides all day and then went out to tea at a Mongolian restaurant in Takapuna.

On Sunday we met at school at 12.30pm and started the long trip home!






