Recently we have been working through our school policies to ensure that they line up with the Department of Education & Training guidelines.



# Grade 3/4 Classroom Report

As always Grade 3 / 4 have been working hard over the last fortnight. They have investigated sentence fluency in writing, expanding their vocabulary in reading and division in numeracy. In addition, they have been using their force and motion knowledge to create a design for the egg drop challenge, where the challenge is to create the safest and slowest falling egg. Grade 3 / 4 were also excited to start learning the language of the term, AUSLAN, some students already knew some and were able to take a leadership role to help other students. Grade 4's have also been practising for Winter Sports.



In writing students worked together to play the sentence fluency game. They had to come up with a sentence with the amount of words the dice said, this meant they either had to write a one- six word sentence. Students enjoyed the challenge. They found it got them thinking about sentence structure and length which is vital for interesting writing. This skill transferred to their persuasive pieces with great results, all students look forward to bringing their pieces home once completed.





On Thursday students 3-6 had a visit from Victoria Police to discuss CyberSafety. Some key messages that Leading Senior Constable Johnston said were:

- Choose a username that does not identify you e.g no real name or age, such as SarahVic12
- Don't just block any suspicious accounts and tell an adult as well

# **Learning focuses**

<u>Week 3-4:</u> Chance and data displays, multiplication up to 10's, persuasive writing, inferring and character traits.

<u>Week 5-6</u>: Multiplication 10 x 10, symmetry, persuasive writing, information reports, summarising, opinions of a text.

# Grade 4/5 Classroom Report



We have had a busy week in our classroom!

In reading we have been working using our Workshop Model and have introduced three new reading response strategies - Character Descriptions, Spot the Setting & Marking the Motivation. We used the book 'The Lost Thing' which really made us think. We also did a 'think, feel, wonder' about an episode of Bluey - which proved to have lots of thought provoking responses to a text!

In Writing we have been writing persuasive pieces using the TEEL to cross check that we are including enough detail in our paragraphs.

In Maths we looked at Multiplication. We practised long multiplication, our times tables and some students even tried out multiplying decimal numbers!

In Investigations we have been looking at an unbiased history of Australia and how we came to have the lives we have now. Students are creating powerpoint presentations answering questions about the First Fleet and about the Indigenous Australians - all powerful (and sometimes confronting) elements of our history.

We have been practising for Winter Sports on Thursday afternoons - each student participating in T-Ball, Netball or Soccer. Students also participated in a talk with the Victoria Police about cyber safety and the ways we can all stay safe online. Keep up the amazing work 4/5!



# Grade 6 Classroom Report

The Grade 6 students continue to work hard in different areas of their learning. In reading, students used a text called 'Digger: The Dog That Went to War' to practise a range of reading and writing strategies. In writing, students continue to work on their persuasive writing. They have designed their own idea or invention and are making advertisements for their product.

In Maths, we have finished our unit on multiplication and division. We will continue to work on these skills in our fluency tasks. It was pleasing to see improvement from all of the students in this topic. We are now moving into fractions, decimals and percentages.

Students have looked at what respect means to them. They were able to reflect about positive role models and how they show respect at school and home.

We have started experimenting with parachutes and students have enjoyed designing their own. Their mission is to safely land an egg using their parachute.

Last week we engaged in a session with a local police officer called 'Think You Know.' This session aimed to educate our students about cyber safety and strategies to make sure they are safe when online. I encourage you to talk to your child about this session and what they learnt from this.

Winter Sports is fast approaching and we continue to train for this day. Students have chosen to participate in either T-Ball, Soccer or Netball.

- Testing weeks commence on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2024.

Please note that the ICAS subject areas shown for selection are at the school's discretion. After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records.

### ICAS results and certificates

All assessments will be conducted online, at school. We will notify you of the date(s) that we will run ICAS assessments, and when your child's ICAS results are ready. Your child's ICAS certificates will be delivered to school. Once we have received them, we will present them to



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your child to bring home. The back of the certificate will show your child's ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin". - Use these to enter the **Results Portal** ortilicasassessments.com/ortiStudent.

# Privacy collection statement

The following information is a privacy notification about how your child's data is kept private and secure.

ICAS Assessment is owned by Janison Salutions Pty Ltd (We, Us, Our).

# Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need. AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.
