This week our Grade 3/4's have been at camp and students at school engaged in specialist subjects across three days, kinder visits and much more.

We know our students are amazing, so we're giving the year 3-6 students the opportunity to showcase and celebrate their talents in the world-renowned ICAS competition this year. ICAS is an online academic competition that gives students the opportunity to challenge their higher order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, and Spelling Bee. Every student who participates is celebrated and recognised with a printed certificate in each subject area, and an online results report to track development each year. 
